135 lagi sekolah diiktiraf SKK

Kementerian Pendidikan mengumumkan sebanyak 135 lagi sekolah di seluruh negara diiktiraf sebagai Sekolah Kluster Kecemerlangan (SKK). Ketua Pengarah Pelajaran, Dato' Sri Dr. Khair Mohamad Yusof berkata, pengiktirafan itu telah menjadikan 506 sekolah kini telah diberi pengiktirafan SKK yang dilakukan secara berfasa sejak program tersebut diperkenalkan pada 2007. Ini bermakna sasaran kerajaan terhadap 500 buah SKK pada 2015 akhirnya tercapai dan menunjukkan perancangan dalam Gelombang 1 Pelan Pembangunan Pendidikan Malaysia (PPPM) 2013-2025 bagi mengiktiraf sekolah cemerlang dan berkualiti sebagai SKK telah berjaya. Menurut beliau, pelaksanaan SKK adalah antara agenda penting Kementerian Pendidikan dalam menjadikan sistem pendidikan negara bertaraf antarabangsa dan ingin melahirkan Malaysia sebagai Pusat Kecemerlangan Pendidikan.

Timbalan Perdana Menteri, Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin menafikan dakwaan segelintir pihak kononnya berlaku ketidakadilan dalam pengagihan peruntukkan kepada sekolah-sekolah di seluruh negara. Beliau yang juga Menteri Pendidikan berkata, kerajaan tidak pernah meminggirkan atau menganaktirikan mana-mana sekolah di bawah kawal seliaannya. Malah jelasnya, agihan peruntukkan kepada sekolah jenis kebangsaan Cina (SJKC) dan sekolah jenis kebangsaan Tamil (SJKT) adalah lebih baik berbanding sekolah kebangsaan yang lebih daif khususnya di kawasan pedalaman, pulau-pulau kecil serta luar bandar., peruntukkan bayaran utiliti bagi sekolah jenis kebangsaan telah dinaikkan daripada RM2,000 kepada RM5,000. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa kementerian telah bersetuju supaya pertambahan peruntukkan bayaran utiliti ini diberikan juga kepada semua sekolah bantuan kerajaan yang lain.

Ketua Pengarah Pelajaran, Dato' Sri Dr. Khair Mohamad Yusof berkata, pencapaian calon yang memperoleh keputusan cemerlang (gred A+, A dan A-) dalam semua mata pelajaran yang diduduki turut menurun apabila tahun ini hanya mencatat 11,289 calon berbanding 13,970 calon pada 2013.

Kerajaan komited untuk mengiktiraf dan menghargai kecemerlangan pelajar seiring dengan matlamat mencapai negara berpendapatan tinggi, kata Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin. Sehubungan itu Timbalan Perdana Menteri berkata, pembangunan modal insan yang berterusan dan terancang akan memastikan bilangan tenaga sumber manusia yang berpengetahuan serta berkemahiran tinggi terus meningkat dalam menghasilkan apa yang dikatakan sebagai 'pool of talent for the future' yang memberi impak besar kepada ekonomi negara.

Tan Sri Muhyiddin yang juga Menteri Pendidikan turut menjelaskan Laporan Daya Saing Global 2014-2015 dikeluarkan Forum Ekonomi Dunia (WEF) sebelum ini telah meletakkan Malaysia ditangga ke-20, melonjak dari kedudukan ke-24 pada tahun sebelumnya.

"Lebih membanggakan lagi ialah kedudukan negara mengatasi negara ekonomi maju seperti Australia, Austria, Perancis dan Korea Selatan.

"Dua belas tonggak utama telah digariskan oleh WEF bagi mencapai tahap daya saing global ini dan tiga tonggak yang diberi perhatian oleh negara adalah persekitaran ekonomi makro, kecekapan pasaran buruh dan kestabilan teknologi," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian dalam ucapannya pada Majlis Penyampaian Surat Tawaran Biasiswa Nasional 2015 di Institut Tadbir Awam Negara (INTAN).

DPM LAUDS BETTER STPM RESULTS

The improvement in 2014 Sijil Tinggi Persekolahan Malaysia (STPM) results shows that the Education Ministry's National Education Development Plan has enhanced teachers and students' performance in achieving excellence. Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said the results also showed that the performance gap between rural and urban students had narrowed. He said it is also an indication that the expansion and effectiveness of the education system as well as the policy practised by the Education Ministry is successful in providing educational opportunities to all levels of society. Tan Sri Muhyiddin, who is also Education Minister, said the ministry was constantly making efforts to raise the education standard and the results were an indicator that the efforts were bearing fruit. He said he was pleased with the students' achievement as the results showed an increase not only in the number of students achieving full pass rate but also on the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), which increased from 2.57 in 2013 to 2.62 last year. He congratulated 41,915 students who obtained full passes in the 2014 STPM, in particular to the 408 students who obtained 'A' in all subjects. Their excellence was also due to the sweat and effort of their families and teachers. Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin reminded students and schools that their achievement was an incentive from their efforts and an encouragement for others to strive for their own success. He said to those who were less successful, do not give up. He believed that if we continue to strive and improve ourselves and God willing, we will succeed.

FEWER STUDENTS SCORE STRAIGHT A'S

The overall Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) achievement declined with fewer students scoring straight A's, and educators attribute this to possibly a change in the way questions were structured. Of the 429,003 students who took the examination last year, 11,289 (2.63%) scored straight A's – compared to 13,970 (3.16%) out of 442,588 students in 2013. The National Average Grade (GPN) was at 5.08, compared with 4.93 in 2013. (A lower GPN shows a better overall performance). Education director-general Datuk Seri Dr Khair Mohamad Yusof said the decline in student performance and the reduced number of top scorers could be due to a change in the way questions were structured. He said the questions were the same as before, but students now need to think more when they answer. He also said they can't just revise lessons the old way, or spot questions, to do well. Those who took the time to properly understand the subject matter would have done well. But the decline is still within the acceptable range, as the overall performance of students will rise and dip slightly through the years. He said this when announcing the analysis of the 2014 SPM results at the Education Ministry in Putrajaya yesterday. The percentage of students who obtained SPM certificates also dropped slightly to 85.02%, from 85.52% the previous year. This is the second SPM examination where students were required to pass History in addition to Bahasa Melayu, to qualify for a certificate. The percentage of students who passed the English subject fell from 80% in 2013 to 77.3%. English will be made a compulsory pass in the SPM from 2016. Some 86% of students passed History in 2014 compared to 86.6% in 2013, while 91.1% passed Bahasa Melayu in 2014 compared to 91.4% in 2013. Comparing the performance of urban and rural students, Datuk Seri Dr Khair said rural school candidates scored GPN points of 5.4 compared to the 4.85 garnered by those from urban schools. He said the performance gap between urban and rural candidates has narrowed to 0.55, compared with 0.60 in 2013.

YOUNG TEACHERS TO GET A LEAP AHEAD IN CLASSROOMS

Young school teachers will soon be able to enhance their students' classroom experience through the Frog Virtual Learning Environment. This will be made possible through the Guru Muda 1Malaysia Programme that uses the Frog VLE as a teaching and learning platform launched yesterday. Education Director-General Datuk Sri Dr Khair bin Mohamad Yusof said that the programme was geared towards equipping young teachers with the skills to fully utilise the Frog VLE platform in their classrooms. He said the Frog VLE is an effective teaching and learning platform under the Ministry of Education's 1BestariNet project. Datuk Sri Dr Khair said the Government is committed to improving the quality of education and the use of technology is in line with the Malaysia Education Blueprint 2013-2025, which provides for the use of ICT to scale up the quality of learning across the country. The programme will involve 5,000 teachers aged 40 and below from 2,500 schools nationwide. The teachers will be participating in hands-on interactive learning workshops and seminars during the programme, which will run for two months. He said the use of Frog VLE in classrooms would be part of the on-going implementation of the Education Ministry's Continuous Professional Development programme. Datuk Sri Dr Khair said there are many uses of the Frog VLE, including performing as both a teaching and learning solution and a platform for performing administrative management tasks. He said as a whole, the Frog VLE is centred around three primary components which are academic-based, communication-based and administrative-based. The programme is organised jointly by the Education Ministry, YTL Communications and FrogAsia.

NEW SYSTEM TO HELP STUDENTS CHOOSE RIGHT VARSITY COURSES

In a bid to reduce the number of disgruntled school leavers who cannot get courses of their choice in local universities, the Education Ministry's centralised university unit (UPU) has come up with a new system. Students can now key in their details and the system will show them the courses for which they are eligible and likely to be accepted. Deputy Education Minister P. Kamalanathan said this was to reduce the number of disgruntled applicants who could not get their chosen courses when they only met the minimum requirements. He said applicants must provide their full names, IC numbers and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), and the system will suggest a list of public universities and the courses (that they qualify for). He told this to reporters after launching a special secretariat to provide guidance to SPM and STPM school leavers on their future study options. He stressed that school leavers had to go through this step before they could enter their choice of courses in UPU. The requirement known as *Semak Syarat* could be found on <http://upu.moe.gov.my>. Although applicants meet a course's minimum requirements, he said there was no guarantee they would get it as there might be other applicants with higher CGPAs. He urged SPM and STPM school leavers to carefully research all their study options to avoid disappointment. On those who did not do well in the examinations, Kamalanathan said they could still enrol in other institutes such as community colleges and polytechnics. On another matter, P. Kamalanathan said he had discussed the issue of parents in Selangor being unable to register their children for Year One in 2017. They can only do so online a year before their children start school. He hoped the issue can be resolved in one or two days.
